## Greentrees Board Elections

Ballots are being mailed to Greentrees owners on October 28th for the 2017 Greentrees Village Board elections. The districts for which directors are being elected this year are $\# 2, \# 4, \# 6$ and $\# 8$. Jeff Myers is running for District 2, George Lyddon is running for District 4, and Kathryn Walbom is running in District 6. No one has announced for District 8 .

Even numbered district owners will be voting for a Board member and two Alternates. Odd numbered district owners will be voting only for the Alternate candidates.

Alternate Directors replace any elected representative not in attendance at a Board of Directors meeting. Alternate Directors are elected from the Association membership at large. There are three candidates running for the Alternate seats this year: Bruce Littlepage, Nick Woodworth and Mark Meyers

If any district has no representative on the Board of Directors, the alternate who receives the greatest number of votes will be appointed by the Board of Directors to fill the position of the vacated seat.

## Road Construction

As of this writing, Greentrees has not yet been able to do the road construction work in the 400s due to inclement weather. The association still plans on doing a two inch over-lay of asphalt on the road in Greentrees North prior to the end of the year. As soon as weather permits, residents will be informed when the five day project will be done.

In the mean time, the City and ODOT have just about completed the pedestrian/bike path along Rhododendron Drive. The 1.2 million dollar project which includes an elaborate concrete retaining wall on the west side of the road and concrete curbs and up-graded signage at the crosswalk at the Greentrees entrances, is in keeping with the design the City promised in its discussions with Greentrees representatives.
