Beginning in May, Greentrees will have a new RV Park host. A few reminders concerning the RV Park:

Everyone using the park must be a resident of Greentrees Village or the guest of a resident. The resident must make the park reservation on behalf of their guest. The resident is ultimately responsible for the guest's fees or any damage they may cause. The maximum initial length of stay in the park is 14 days. The cost is \$21.80 per night.

Architectural Committee Tips *by RB Taylor*

Spring is here at last and with it the need to cut back the vegetation that invades our properties each year.

As a reminder, the bins at several locations around the park are provided for each of us to put our cuttings into, but they are limited to the amount they can hold and we ask that you not overfill them. The bins are normally picked up on each Tuesday and sometimes on Thursday each week. If you hire someone to cut back the growth around your lot, please make sure that they take the waste to the recycling plant and not dump it in the bins. The commercial contractors that cut back the growth in the lots normally have enough material to fill more than one bin at a time. You do the math - we only have a short period of time each year to clean up the over growth and we have 567 lots that would like to put their clippings into the bins. Please be considerate.

I would also like to remind everyone that if you are planning on making additions to your home or lot, you need to check with the Architectural Committee to see if you need to obtain a permit. Generally a permit is required if you are planning to add any type of addition that would change the coverage of the lot. The Architectural Committee receives its authority from the Association's CC&Rs, Bylaws and ORS94.630.

2017 HUD Survey

During the months of May and June, members of the Board of Directors will be canvassing their districts in Greentrees for the 2017 HUD survey. Every two years, in order to maintain our 55-and-older status with HUD, the Association is required to survey each home to confirm that the Association's records are correct concerning who is registered as living there. In May and June, Board volunteers will be coming to your door to speak to you regarding who occupies your home.

Check Reminder

Just a reminder, if you pay your monthly assessment to the Association with a check, please remember to write your lot number on the check. That will assure that your account gets properly credited.
