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Cable Contract Inked

Spectrum/Charter multi-year deal with GTV HOA includes highspeed Internet and more TV channels while rolling back cost



Greentrees residents should be smiling when they get their Spectrum bill this month.

The new Spectrum/ Charter contract has been finalized, and it now includes high-speed Internet, more cable channels, and two cable boxes as part of the "base" package for GTV residents.

That can be a savings of more than

\$80/month for some Greentrees' property owners who have up until now been paying an up-charge for these Spectrum premium cable TV/Internet services.

The Spectrum Committee (Ron McCrary, Bruce Littlepage, Tom Shaw, Fred Burns, and Pat Miller) successfully renegotiated the five year contract that was ending this year.

Last year the BOD hired cable consultant Mark Weaver to do two things for us: Complete a very detailed survey of exactly what kind of infrastructure we had in place in regards to cable wiring and other things, and provide valuable information regarding the negotiations concerning the contract and the industry as a whole. With Weaver's insights, Ron McCrary, the Chair of the committee who played a vital role along with Matthw Kennedy, negotiated this five (5) year cable contract for Greentrees.

Here are some highlighted improvements in the new contract:

- High Speed Internet (Ultra Service) w/free modem
- 60 Month (5 Year) Term with a 12 month auto renewal
- 4% yearly increase not starting until 2024
- Two (2) set-top boxes to accomodate two TVs
- Bronze Service added with extra channels

The <u>Spectrum "TV Bronze"</u> package that has about 175 channels including HD. (The previous GTV "Select" package was 125 channels without HD.) The office has a copy of the channel list if you want one.

Cable subscribers who want to record TV shows will still need to rent a DVD box from Spectrum because the two "free" set-top boxes that provide the signal to the TV(s) don't have that recording functionality.

The new contract also provides homeowners with high-speed<u>Internet</u> that includes a free modem. That means faster connections to the web and the ability to stream movies on your computer, smartphones, laptops and tablets. Connection speed is 400Mbps according to Spectrum.

Note: Spectrum will still charge a one-time \$49.95 setup fee to have a technician come to your home to install the modem and handle the Internet setup. Call Spectrum (833)-697-7328 to get more information.

Kennedy says these new rates and services should be reflected

in GTV homeowner's Spectrum/ Charter February statement.

The results of the Board of Directors election results were announced at the BOD meeting held on January 12th. Here's a list of the 2021 Board of Directors and the Districts in which they represent:



Now that Oregon's frontline workers, health care workers, residents of long-term care facilities have been getting the COVID-19 vaccinations, residents over age 65 should now be eligible for the same. Or not.

Here's the Oregon's Vaccine Advisory Committee's (OVAC) current priority list:

BIPOC: Black, African American, Hispanic/Latino, Indigenous, tribal and urban-based Natives, Pacific Islanders.

Adults 16-64 with chronic conditions

Adults and youth eligible for vaccine in custody; prison and jail frontline workers.

Multi-generational homes.

People under the age of 65 living in low-income senior housing and other congregate senior housing.

The OAVC says the above list "reflects some of the groups that have been disproportionately impacted by COVID-19, including people of color, individuals who are incarcerated and those with certain underlying conditions such as heart conditions, kidney disease or cancer."
