Electronic Locks For Clubhouse

The new electronic locks have been installed on the Clubhouse doors. At the October board of directors meeting, the Board will set the hours for the new locks, and in November they will be activated.

The locks will automatically lock after regular business hours and residents will need either a gate pass, a gate card, or one of the new key fobs to enter the building. At 10 o'clock the new locks will automatically lockdown and resident's cards and passes will not open the doors until the next morning.

The locks are being installed as a security measure to keep people who don't belong in the Clubhouse out during those hours when GTV has minimum staff on duty - between the hours of 4 PM and 10 PM.

The new key fobs mentioned above may be purchased from the GTV office, and will open the Clubhouse doors the same as a gate pass or gate card. The fobs may be kept on a key ring for those residents who don't want to remove their gate pass or gate card from their car each time they wish to use the Clubhouse after hours. They should be available for sale by mid-October and will cost \$6 each.
