GTV Water/Sewer System Showing Signs Of Its Age

Keeping Greentrees 50-year-old underground infrastructure running smoothly requiring more frequent maintenance

When there was a break in the late January rains and water was still bubbling up through the cracks of his concrete driveway, John Hunt, Lot 504 on the West side, knew there was a problem brewing underground. He alerted the GTV maintenance staff, and after some sleuthing, the unexpected flow of water was traced to a leak in the water-main running deep under the Hunt's driveway.

A couple weeks later a crew from Johnson Rock Products rolled in with their mini-excavator and a four-man crew to repair the leak by replacing the failed water and saddle assembly. The workers removed a section of the concrete driveway slab and dug down nearly five feet to reach the water main. By day's end, the leak was fixed.

Several days later, a half-mile away on the East side of Greentrees, another Johnson Rock Products crew dug deep under South Street to remove and replace two sections of underground sewer line partially blocked by tree roots that had penetrated the walls. The damage caused by the roots were exposed by a video inspection of that portion of the main sewer line.

"Such repairs are to be expected with an underground infrastructure that's going on 50 years," said one of the Johnson Rock supervisors working on both repairs. "It's just getting old."

BUILDING ON SAND


Bob Fiscus, our GTV maintenance supervisor, said Florence (and GTV) is built on the northern end of the sand dunes we see across the river in the Oregon Dunes National Recreation Area.

Recurring issues with the water mains and sewer lines is

the result of age combined with what lies beneath our feet.

"The damage can be caused by a number of reasons but usually from above or below ground pressure cracking the pipe itself," said Fiscus.

"The pipes can be leaking for years and we don't know until we see it above ground

or get some other indicator."

Bill Johnson, the GTV HOA President says, "We have a very unique situation with our soil being almost completely sand on top of a high water table here in Florence.

"Sustained pressure coming from weight above ground, along with pressure coming from below, is leading to cracks and breaks in the system."

A DRAIN ON RESERVES

These types of repairs are not cheap. The typical cost to make these spot repairs on water and sewer lines can range from \$5,000-\$10,000 per incident depending on the extent of the work needed.

When the additional repairs to the waterline "T"s feeding homes is added in, it's become a big HOA budget item.

"We will have more future repairs as we go along, and those will only increase as time goes on," said Matt Kennedy, our GTV General Manager. "It becomes more and more important to have the proper level of funding in the Reserves for future repairs with older Communities.

"The Finance Committee/Board did decide to raise dues a considerable amount based on the full on-site Reserve Study completed in early 2020. About \$10.00 of that monthly assessment increase was marked for water line and underground future repairs for Greentrees."

EXPERT CONSULTANTS

At the same time as the Reserve Study was going on, Kennedy put together a team of experts to help get a realistic handle on what the community is facing down the road. He consulted with Florence city works experts, and hired a local engineer from Coos Bay to study the Village and go over the original plans of the underground infrastructure that was installed in 1971. Kennedy also consulted with the engineer that completed a similar study in 2011 to see the progression of the aging.

"One thing that I have found going through this process, and doing some very thorough investigation, is inflation plays a major role in future costs of repairs," said Kennedy.

"About every 20 years the cost of these types of underground

infrastructure repairs will double due to inflation, if you calculate on or above three percent. So we need to be financially ready." ~ Bruce Smith

GARDENING

How To Stop A "Slug Fest"

Slugs and snails are a problem all over the Pacific Northwest, and more so because they are both hermaphrodites with each adult having both male and female reproductive organs.

That makes them a real concern to gardners becasue one can result in many, many more. Slugs reach maturity in three to six months, and the <u>European red slug</u> found in our area here along the Oregon coast can lay 500 eggs a year according to the OSU Extension Service

Fortunately, many animals prey on slugs and snails, including toads, snakes, birds, porcupines and raccoons, all of which frequent our local area.

OSU experts also say homeowners can help curtail a slug festan using an inverted flower pot with one edge propped up with cabbage leaves, or orange/grapefruit rinds underneath. This is a very effective slug trap.

Place pot traps out in the evening and check daily. You can also use beer, or a yeast-and-honey mixture, in a deep yogurt container, set in the ground with the container's rim level with the ground.

Check traps daily wearing gloves, and drop the slugs (and snails) in a bucket of soapy water to kill them. Empty and refill every couple of days.

Here's another tip from the OSU experts, if you get slime on your

skin, wash it off with white vinegar and warm water.

If trapping slugs isn't your thing, a more agressive method is usng Iron Phosphate (Sluggo, Escar-Go), which interferes with calcium metabolism in the gut, causing snails

and slugs to stop feeding and die three to six days later.

Iron phosphate is safe to use around pets, humans, fish, birds, beneficial insects, and mammals, food crops, greenhouses, and berry gardens up to harvest.

THE BEAR FACTS

This is the month to begin keeping an eye out for the bears. Late March is when our local black bears start emerging from "hibernation" along with their cubs born over the winter.

Black bears, which number between 25,000-30,000 state-wide, are regular visitors around Greentrees and the Florence area. But residents shouldn't be scared; local records indicate no one has ever been attacked by a bear here along our coast.

"Bear sightings in Élorence are related to garbage and bird feeders," says wildlife biologist Jason Kirchner from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW).

Our local bears are only looking for easy sources to the foods they love: seeds, nuts, berries and sweets. They have excellent noses and bird feeders, food left out for cats and dogs, hummingbird feeders, and garbage are key attractants.

"We're really encouraging folks to only put their garbage can out the day the garbage truck comes. They should also stop feeding the birds, as bears love bird seed," says Kirchner.

If those food sources are not left out in the open or hanging around, the bears will look for other places to scout for food.


If the extremely rare occurrence a black bear here does get aggressive, experts say you should stand your ground: Make noise, clap your hands, and look bigger by standing on steps or your porch. Our bears will quickly run away from loud noises.

3M Corp sells non-valved N95 masks for about \$1.19 each. They can be found at most hardware stores. Only use non-valved N95 masks made in the USA. (Do not use valved N95 masks.)

Double-layer cloth masks may be used if they have a sheet of HEPA material as a filter between the two layers of cloth. Amazon has the HEPA PM2.5 active-carbon filter inserts for cloth masks in packs of 50 for less than \$7.00.
