# The 2019 Annual Meeting by Bruce Littlepage

The annual meeting of Greentrees owners was held on Saturday August 3rd. There were approximately 233 owners in attendance. Following reports from the Treasurer, Manager and Greentrees committees and clubs, there was a hearing of the members. The main topic people wanted to speak about was the proposal from Spectrum/Charter to possibly bundle internet service into our contract which comes up for renewal in December of this year. Steve Lyon explained the pros and cons which opened up a question and answer forum among our residents. We are still in negotiations with Spectrum so nothing has been decided as of yet.

Our assessments fees for 2020 will remain at \$228.00 per month. If a decision is made regarding adding Internet service with Spectrum/Charter it won't effect our HOA dues until 2021. The Board is asking the owners to way in on this issue since it would affect the amount that you pay in monthly assessments. We will be mailing out a ballot in late October to each resident. Upon receipt of these ballots we will determine if the Greentrees Home Owners Association should pursue a bulk and bundled contract with Spectrum for cable video *and* internet services. Be sure to vote on this important issue because your input will determine how we proceed regarding this matter.

As I mentioned at the meeting, our General Manager, Louis Dashofy will be retiring in December of this year. Louis has been a great asset to Greentrees Village for the past thirteen years and will be sorely missed. We have a committee in charge of canvassing and hiring a replacement General Manager and we hope to start conducting interviews in the near future.

Following the Annual Meeting, the Association hosted a luncheon for the members in attendance. Homeowners Tom Benson, Susan Skerlak, Bruce Cronk, and Mark Tilchen were the people primarily responsible for planning, cooking and serving the hot lunch, although many other hands assisted. By all accounts, it was a lovely lunch and a festive occasion.

## Free CPR Class at GTV

The Siuslaw Fire Department will hold a free CPR class in Greentrees on Saturday, September 21st at 10 am in our Recreation Hall. Trainers from the fire department will be on hand with CPR dummies to practice on. They will be teaching 'Hands Only' CPR.

Hands only CPR is quite simple and just about anyone can do it. The rescuer starts compressions over the heart, at about the nipple line, and compresses at a regular rhythm. In essence, that is all the bystander needs to do until the ambulance shows up. If you are interested in taking this free class, please sign up in the Clubhouse Library so that the trainers know how many to expect.

### Be Prepared!

September is Emergency Preparedness Month. Living on the Oregon coast comes with the constant threat of Earthquake on the Cascadia Subduction Zone and or Tsunami. Oregon Emergency Management (OEM) and FEMA Recommend every person have an Emergency To Go Kit and a Disaster Plan. At a minimum your Emergency To Go Kit should have the items listed below:

- Water: 1 gallon per day per person 3 day supply for evacuation, 2 weeks supply for home (Shelter in Place)
- Food: non-perishable easy-to-prepare items ( 3-day supply for evacuation, 2 -weeks supply for home)
- Manual can-opener
- Flashlight with extra Batteries
- Battery powered or hand- crank Radio (NOAA Weather Radio if possible)
- First Aid Kit
- Medications (7- day supply min)
- Multi purpose tool
- Sanitation and Personal Hygiene items
- Emergency Blanket
- Hearing aids with extra batteries & reading glasses.

The Greentrees Emergency Response Team (GERT) meets at 1pm on the second Thursday of the month.
