

HOA Annual Election - PLEASE VOTE

Owners should receive ballots in the mail late October. Be sure to return them by the deadline indicated in the mailer. Ballots that are not completed properly must be discarded. If you have questions or uncertain how to complete your ballot, stop by the Greentrees office. If you live in an odd-numbered district you are voting for your district representative and alternates. If you live in an even-numbered district you are only voting for alternates. Ballots are mailed to the address you have on record in the office. Voting is in November.

Board and Alternate Candidates

If you gave your name to the office but did not fill out a candidate form, you need to go back to the office and do so.

In the November newsletter there will be an insert with nominee statements. If you would like to make a statement about your run, it needs to be submitted by noon on October 21. Electronic statements preferred delivered to the office on a USB (thumb) drive as a WORD document or emailed as text to activityGTV@gmail.com. If submitting a typed statement (handwritten not accepted), font size no larger than 12 point, single spaced on white paper with 1/2" margins. You may include a photo of yourself (headshot). Photos will be printed black and white. Maximum 250 words. Provide your full name as you want it to appear, lot and district number (not included in the 250 word count.) A statement is NOT required. It is your choice. A candidate statement introduces you and what you can do for the community. You decide what you want to say. Suggestions include: who you are, your background, why you qualify, views on community issues, experiences, accomplishments.

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HOA President's Message

This election season is upon us, and we have two elections scheduled. First a **bylaws election** that started on September 21st; and secondly, the annual **Board of Directors**



election that starts on

October 29th, to elect Board members from odd numbered districts (1 3 5 7 9) and Alternates At-Large from all districts. You should have received your ballot information on the Bylaw Election already.

The Board of Directors (Board) was made aware of conflicts regarding the number of Alternates elected and duration of their term in the Association's Bylaws, <u>Article IV</u>, <u>District Representatives and Alternates</u>. The Board appointed the Governing Documents Review Ad Hoc Committee (GDRC) to undertake the task of identifying the issues and to recommend proposed changes to the Board.

GDRC's recommended changes were presented to the Board. The Board approved those changes along with two additional changes requested by members of the Board. At GDRC's request, the Board also voted to submit the proposed changes to our attorney. Our attorney approved the proposed changes. The result is the proposed amendments you are being asked to vote on.

I would encourage you to vote for the proposed changes to the Bylaws. Please complete the ballot, place it in the privacy envelope, and then into the self-addressed return envelope. Please sign and put your lot number on the back of the self-addressed return envelope in order for your vote to be counted.

Return the envelope to Greentrees office in person or by mail. Please be aware that these ballot envelopes will not be opened for several weeks, so ... please do not put your assessment check in with the ballot as the envelopes will not be opened immediately.

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






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GERT NEWS

Greentrees Emergency Response Team

We must be prepared as individuals, for a major disaster. A major earthquake and tsunami could leave us without any outside help for weeks. Inserted in this newsletter is an emergency supply list from Lane County. It is designed to help you build an emergency supply over a 12-week period.

Oregon's Department of Consumer and Business Services encourages Oregonians to take stock of their insurance coverage. Their main points are:

- The typical homeowner and renters insurance policy does not cover earthquakes or floods. Special coverage can be purchased, but do not wait until the last minute. Flood insurance must be purchased 30 days before coverage starts.
- Earthquake insurance does not cover a loss caused by landslides erosion, tsunami, or volcanic eruption, even if an earthquake causes them to happen. Coastal residents can get flood insurance through the National Flood Insurance Program that will protect against a tsunami. Visit www.floodsmart.gov. Landslide and erosion coverage are available through specialty programs.
- 3. Sewer and drain backup can flood your home and is a common cause of loss often excluded on homeowner insurance policies. Many companies offer optional coverage for sewer/drain backup with a special limit, usually \$5,000 to \$20,000, for a small additional premium. Consider this option and make a conscious choice before you suffer a loss. Even if you are a renter and the owner insures the damage to the building, that coverage will not extend to your personal property.

COVID vaccine is available in Florence. For locations go to https://getvaccinated.oregon.gov Currently the following are listed: Bi-Mart, Fred Meyer, Florence Pharmacy, Rite Aid, Safeway. Check to see if appointment is required.

Little Food Pantry is a service provided by the Eugene non-profit Burrito Brigade. They address food insecurity at a local level. Their motto, "Take what you need. Give what you can." Neighbors helping neighbors. A pantry will be installed in Greentrees at the end of September, stocked

by residents and Florence Lions Club. It will be at #318, near the park bench, Eastside, left on 1st St. Items that could attract bears will be removed near dusk each evening and returned each morning. Please leave non-canned items before dusk. Items can be taken at any time and canned items can be left anytime. For information or questions call project coordinator Patty Harrison, 541-461-2639.

HOA DUES

The monthly dues you pay has two parts. Operating expenses run the day-to-day operations - everything from the TV service in your home to the pools. The Reserves, which are required by state law, are used to pay for major repairs such as infrastructure.

The board announced a \$4 dues increase for 2022. Although inflation is currently more than 5%, only \$2 (about a 1% increase) is for operating costs. The other \$2 goes to the Reserves. If you have attended board meetings or read minutes you know that our reserves are underfunded.

Money Savings Tip


Winter means higher heating bills. A first step to cut costs is understanding where you are spending money. Our electric company, Central Lincoln PUD, estimates the average home cost as -


For every \$1 spent on home energy:

- ⇒ 45¢ home heating
- ⇒ 35¢ water heating
- ⇒ 10¢ refrigerator/freezer
- ⇒ 10¢ lighting, cooking, entertainment, other




