With the coming of November, I am reminded of the US Marines birthday and Veterans Day. I thought it would be fitting to let our Veterans in Greentrees know about *Honor Flight* which I had the privilege and honor of going on last month.

Honor Flight is dedicated to transporting America's veterans to Washington, D.C. to visit the memorials dedicated to honoring those who have served and sacrificed for our country. These memorials were built to honor our service, and I believe it is imperative as Veterans we have the opportunity to see them.

I went on my trip along with 59 other veterans, our guardians and team leaders (September 30th thru October 4th). All transportation, food, lodging and other costs are paid by Honor Flight. Each Vet has a guardian who helps them get around which was so helpful for me. My guardian also explained all aspects of our trip, meal arrangements and whether or not I would need a wheelchair.

In the five days I was there, our group went to the Lincoln Memorial, the Vietnam Wall, the Korean War Veterans Memorial and the World War II Veterans Memorial. We also were able to visit the F.D.R. Memorial and Arlington Cemetery for the changing of the guard at The Tomb of the Unknown Solider (complete quiet must be observed). In addition, I visited the U.S. ARMY and Navy Museum along with The Air Force Memorial and the Marine Corps War Memorial.

All I can say is, it was an *Awesome* experience. Above all to remember friends, comrades lost and to share stories with other Vets. I have been truly moved by this trip.






