President's Comments – September 2026

Change – we are undergoing a lot of change here at GTV. Change can be unsettling and disruptive. The board is working to minimize the disruption as much as we can.

First, most of you know that the office staff quit suddenly. The board is working on several options for replacement. First, we are talking with the HOA management company to come in to take over our accounting systems as soon as possible. We are working with them and our attorney on a contract that is acceptable to both of us. We are continuing to negotiate the contract for full time management; we expect that to go into effect about January 1. Second, we have contacted the staffing company that Leslie had contacted earlier to look into hiring an office assistant. In the meantime, the board is working the office from 9 AM to 12 noon, Monday – Friday. We are accepting and processing payments, paying our vendors and our staff. There are a couple things we are still figuring out but we anticipate getting everything resolved shortly.

Board elections are here. Districts 2, 4, 6, and 8 are up for election this cycle, as well as alternates. To run for district rep, you must be a homeowner in that district. Homeowner is defined by state law as your name must be on the title; if your home is in trust, you must be the trustee; or if your home is in an LLC, you must be the managing member. In addition, your dues, fines, and fees must be current. Alternates can be from any district and must meet the same criteria of homeowner with dues, fees, fines paid. The nominations open tomorrow, Sept 16, and close on Oct 14. Homeowners in the even districts will vote for their district rep; all homeowners will vote for alternates.

Some thoughts about running for the board. You must have a thick skin! Know that no matter what you do, you won't please everyone. There will always be someone who thinks you are wrong, or should have voted a different way. The board members must do what is right for Greentrees as a whole, not themselves or a friend. In the past, some board members have received hate mail, texts, emails. And this job doesn't really give you a day off. I get calls, emails, or texts 7 days a week, as early at 6:30 AM and until 9 PM. And we all do this for free – because we care about Greentrees and want to make and keep it a great place to live. If you want to join us, run for the board. And now, we have some work to do!

Manager's Report

As mentioned earlier, the office staff have left. The board is working in engaging with AMS for an accounting only short term contract.

The family pool is now closed for the season.

We are scheduling the last of the water works project – the 7 valves needing replacement – with the vendor. We don't have a schedule yet, but we will let everyone know as soon as we do.

We also have some maintenance work scheduled for the heat pumps. And we are working to schedule some electrical work for the gazebo and kitchen fan fixes.

Greentrees Emergency Response Team (GERT) will be participating in the 2026 Great ShakeOut on October 15th in the Rec-Hall at 10:15am. The GERT team will be in a mock disaster drill, focusing on Search and Rescue (SAR), disaster first aid, and Radio Communication. Volunteers are needed as disaster victims, complete with stage blood, and stick-on tattoo cuts. Walking wounded may also be needed in assisting the SAR Team in their disaster recoveries. All aspects of the drill are scripted, as well as the victims' injuries.

The Great ShakeOut is a worldwide Earthquake Drill, which is the 3rd Thursday in October at the same time as the date. This worldwide drill last year had over 60.3 million registered. In the state of Oregon, 500,070 were registered.

Nominations are now open for District Representatives and Alternates for the 2027–2028 term.

District Representatives for even-numbered Districts 2, 4, 6, and 8 are up for election. Four Alternates from the community will also be elected. District Representatives, who shall serve on the Board of Directors, are elected for a two-year term. Successful candidates will be seated at the January 19, 2027, meeting of the Board of Directors.

Alternates, who may be appointed to the Board of Directors as vacancies occur, are elected for a one-year term, with service periods determined by our Bylaws.

If you are interested in either position, please visit the Greentrees office to file a Nomination Form. Nominations close at 11:59 AM on October 14, 2026.

A Candidates' Forum will be held in the Recreation Hall on Thursday, October 22, at 6:00 PM. Candidate statements of up to 250 words will be accepted to be published in the November Village Voice and on our website. Candidates may also submit a current (within a year) photo to be included with the statement (photos may be resized). Statements, preferably in Word, and photos must be emailed to manager@gtvhoa.com by 11:59 AM, October 19, 2026.

Submitting a statement and being present at the Forum are both meaningful ways for candidates to meet community members and communicate their message. For those candidates that participate in the Candidates' Forum and have submitted a candidate statement, the office will provide copies of your statement at the Forum.

Districts 2, 4, 6, and 8 owners will receive ballots listing candidates for their District Representative seat as well as the Alternate candidates. Districts 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9 will receive ballots for Alternate candidates only.

Ballots will be mailed by October 23, 2026, to owners at the address on file with the office. Ballots must be received in the office by 11:59 AM, November 30, 2026. Please follow all ballot instructions carefully. For your vote to count, you must sign your name and lot number in the space provided on the back of the provided return envelope. Do NOT return your dues check in this envelope.

Committee Reports

ACC Committee

In August, our committee focused on clearing older items, processing current applications, and tightening our procedures.

We reviewed a series Of pending applications and previously started projects, closing out several that had been completed and approving multiple new permits covering fences, dog runs. and hard-surface repairs and extensions. We addressed a situation involving unpermitted work in a greenbelt, documented conditions, and coordinated with management on next steps while outlining a clear, compliant path forward for the resident.

On the policy side, we advanced a comprehensive ACC procedures framework that clarifies responsibilities tor pins and measurements, incident-of-concern investigations, greenbelt maintenance, and non-conforming structures. We reaffirmed that the ACC is a fact-finding body and that enforcement and penalties are handled by management and the board. We supported a right-of-way and utility-protection policy for board consideration and expanded owner education materials to reduce confusion and future violations.

Activities Committee Report

The Root Beer Float event on Labor Day weekend was a success with about 65 cans of soda and over 2 gallons of ice cream given out. And a successful community yard sale this past weekend.

Next up is a chili cookout with our potluck on Sept. 25. Make up a batch of your favorite chili and see if you can win the top spot. Bring your recipe to share with others.

And we are coming up on the holiday parties. October is Halloween potluck and costume party on Oct. 30. Then comes Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday dinners. For those, we really need people to sign up in advance so we can make sure we have enough food for everyone. We will also deliver to homebound people for these events and will need them to sign up for this as well.

Many people do not realize that smoke alarms should be replaced every 10 years, even if they still appear to be working. Over time, the sensors inside smoke alarms can become less reliable. Dust, age, and normal wear can affect their ability to detect smoke quickly.

It is also important to test your smoke alarms regularly and replace batteries as needed. A smoke alarm that does not work cannot provide the warning your family may need during an emergency.

Don't wait until it is too late. A few minutes spent checking your smoke alarms could save a life.

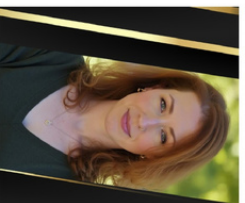

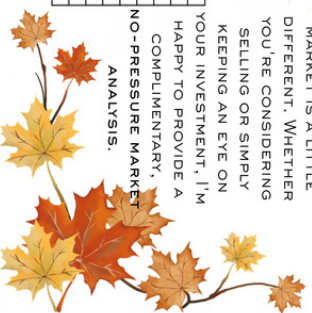
