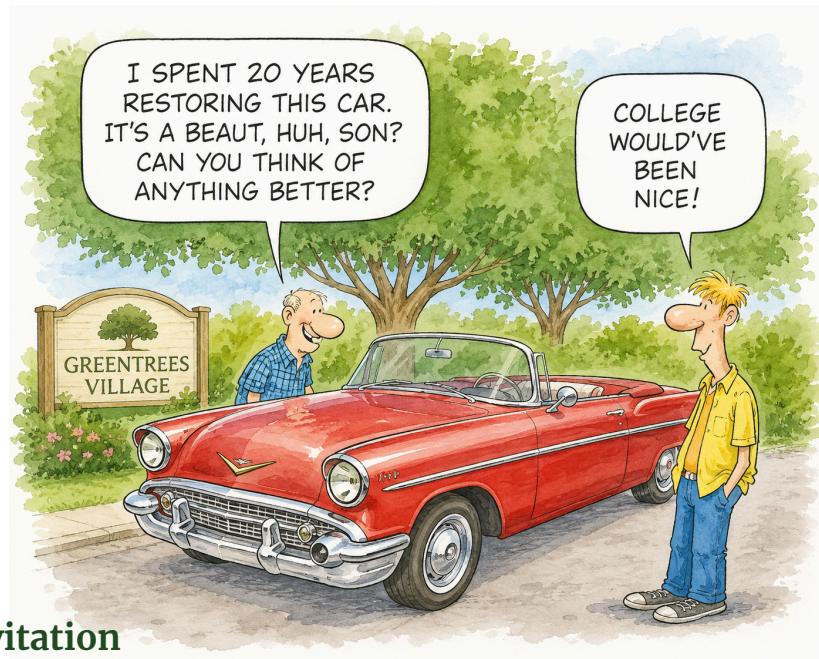

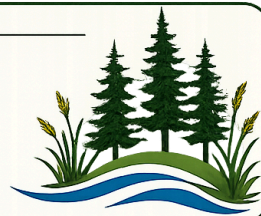

President's Message

I generally talk about the 5 'c's of collaboration, cooperation, compromise, civility and change. This month I want to address social media, which impacts two of these: civility and cooperation.

Social media is a great tool for keeping up with family and friends, and sharing information. Greentrees Village has an official Facebook page, administered by the Communications Committee, to share information from the office, maintenance, and board. There are also several other unofficial pages focused on Greentrees that are administered by residents. These are generally useful for sharing information about events and things happening in the community.

Lately, however, there have been some posts on social media about board business. Unfortunately, much of these posts and comments rely on second hand information and speculation and end up spreading misinformation. Most of the posters /commenters have not attended any of the board workshops, district meetings, or committee meetings where these items were debated and discussed. Nor have they contacted any board member about these items.

As a board, our code of ethics prevents us from posting about board business that we will vote on. In addition, many of the board members are not on social media. Therefore, we will not be responding to these posts online.

The board is listening to you by holding monthly district meetings, and board workshops. District meetings allow you to a greater interaction, especially about district issues. Board workshops allow you to learn and ask questions about upcoming board agenda items. Remember however, that the board agenda is not finalized until after the workshop, so additional topics may be added to the agenda. Workshop topics are finalized about a week prior to the workshop and again, some issues may be discovered after the agenda is published. Committee meetings are a place to understand what each committee is working on and understand the topics and issues they are dealing with. Board meetings are where the board does their business; audience members are there to observe and listen.

If you have questions about a current or potential board action, I strongly encourage you to contact your district rep to get the facts. You can also contact me directly. We have set up new email accounts and you can reach me at president@gtvhoa.com. I will respond to you with accurate, factual information.

Manager position:

On the topic of the manager position, the board is currently investigating two options – a property management company and benefits for our employees. One team is researching property management companies to determine the services, staffing and costs. The 2nd team is investigating wages and benefits; if we want to attract and retain good employees, we must offer these. Once both teams have completed their research, we will be holding a town hall to report our findings to the community and get feedback.

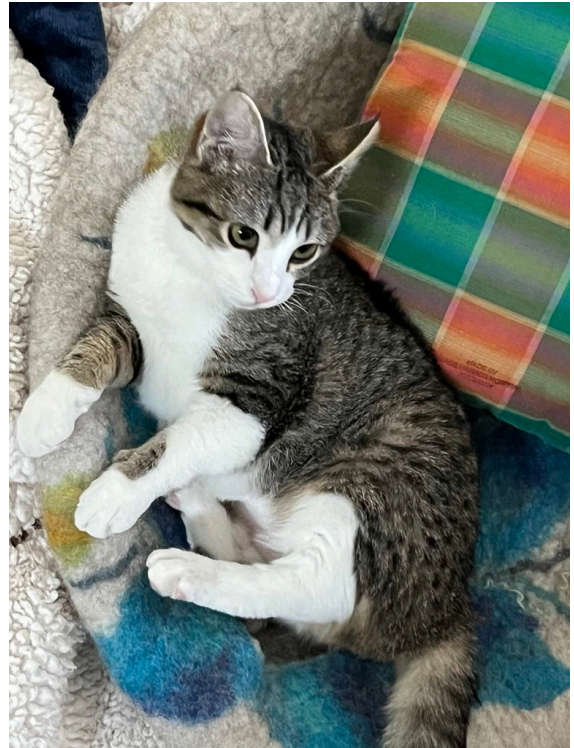


Village Pet

Letter to the Editor

Dear Residents of Greentrees,

I am writing to express my strong opposition to the proposal for cluster mailboxes. While the boxes themselves may be free, the community remains responsible for significant installation and ongoing maintenance costs. Furthermore, USPS regulations confirm our current mailbox configuration is grandfathered in, meaning our mail delivery is not at risk.

Centralized stations will reduce convenience and create significant accessibility barriers, disproportionately impacting our elderly and disabled neighbors who rely on mobility aids or may be housebound. Greentrees lacks the infrastructure for this change, and I believe we should instead focus on repairing our existing mailbox stands to preserve resident independence.

I urge you to consider these long-term impacts and reject the proposal.

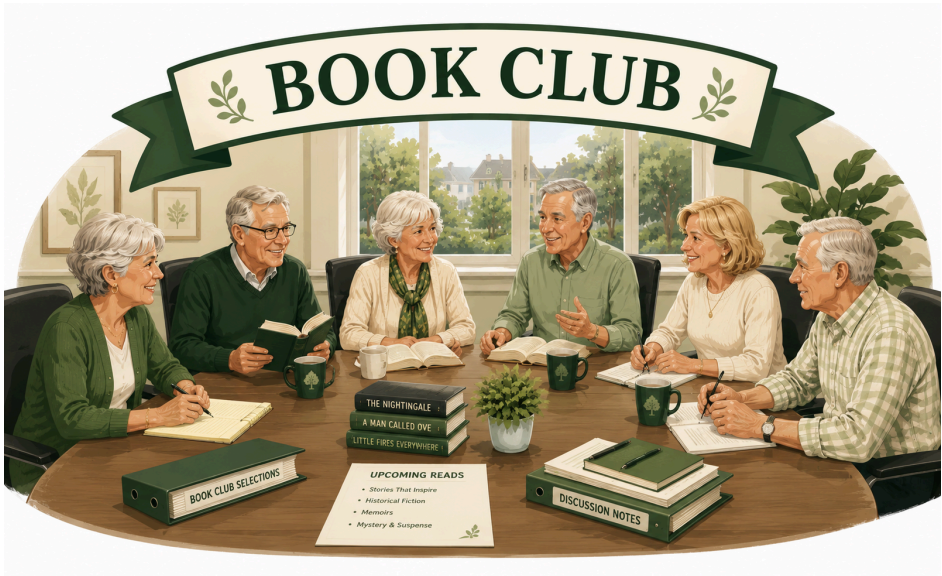

What's Happening on our Board?

It has been a busy quarter for the 2026 Board of Directors. Our Board meetings have been well attended and we are receiving positive feedback from homeowners that our President is doing a good job of keeping the Board orderly. Having Will VonDauster serve as our Parliamentarian has been another plus in keeping our meetings orderly. We have implemented Board Workshops this year, hoping to get agenda items out to the homeowners early so they have a chance to come and listen to Board input and also give the Board your feedback on Agenda items. These workshops are held the Tuesday before the Board meeting at 1:00 in the Rec Hall. They are strictly an opportunity for the Board and homeowners to discuss agenda items - no votes take place at the workshops.

As you all know, we have lost our General Manager James Tennison. This is a big void for our community and the Board is working diligently for a solution that will best serve our community. The Board has divided in to two teams of 4. Team 1 is looking to outsource the HOA Management to a management company and Team 2 is researching the cost of hiring a new manager and providing benefits (medical/vacation/retirement plan) to our employees. In today's job market, employees need benefits and a living wage. Once each team has completed their research, they will bring their information to the homeowners and get your input on which way you feel is the best for Greentrees. We hope to have this information to you before the June Board meeting. We will keep you updated.

Lastly, we have received feedback that our Board minutes are not as detailed as they have been in the past. We have had our attorney review them and we have asked Will (our Parliamentarian) review them also and both say the minutes are written correctly. If you want more detail (discussions of Board members), you will need to attend Board meetings.

Please attend your District meetings - this is where you have a voice. As Board members, we want to hear from you - this is your community and your voice is important to us.

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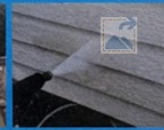
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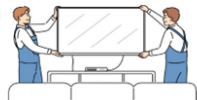

- Up to \$1,000 toward an emergency building repair bill
- Up to \$500 toward the repair of a washer or dryer (a washer and/or dryer replacement if the repair estimate exceeds 65% of the value of the current ones)
- Up to \$500 once within a 12-month period toward a utility bill
- Up to \$1,000 once within a 12-month period toward past due or delinquent property tax bill.

To apply, drop in at the Siuslaw Outreach Services main service center on 12th Street in Florence, Monday through Thursday between 10am and 3:30pm. Applicants may also make an appointment by calling 541-997-2816. Eligible applicants must have resided in Greentrees for past 6 months and be the homeowner. Applicants must provide documents of the estimates to resolve needed repairs.

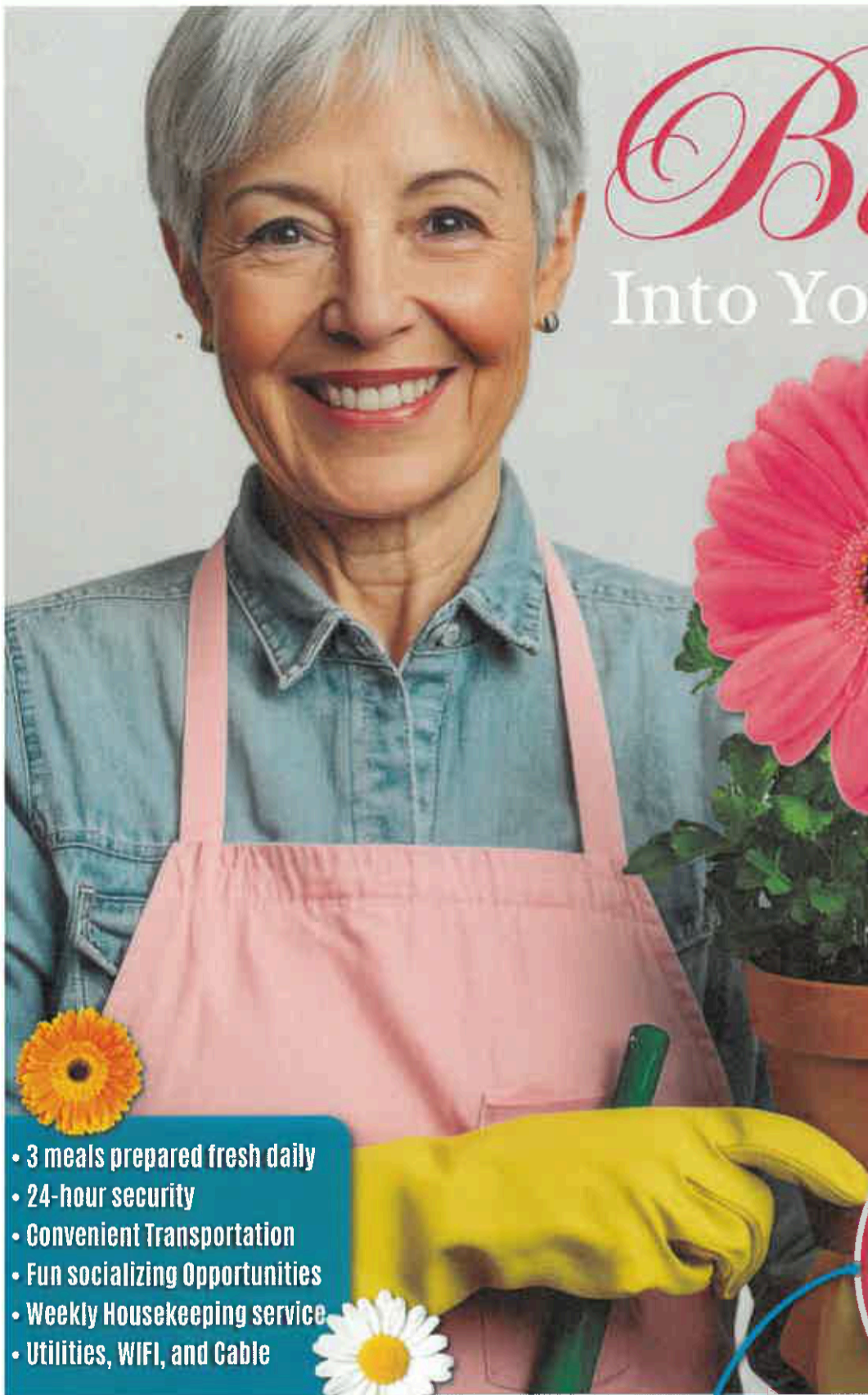

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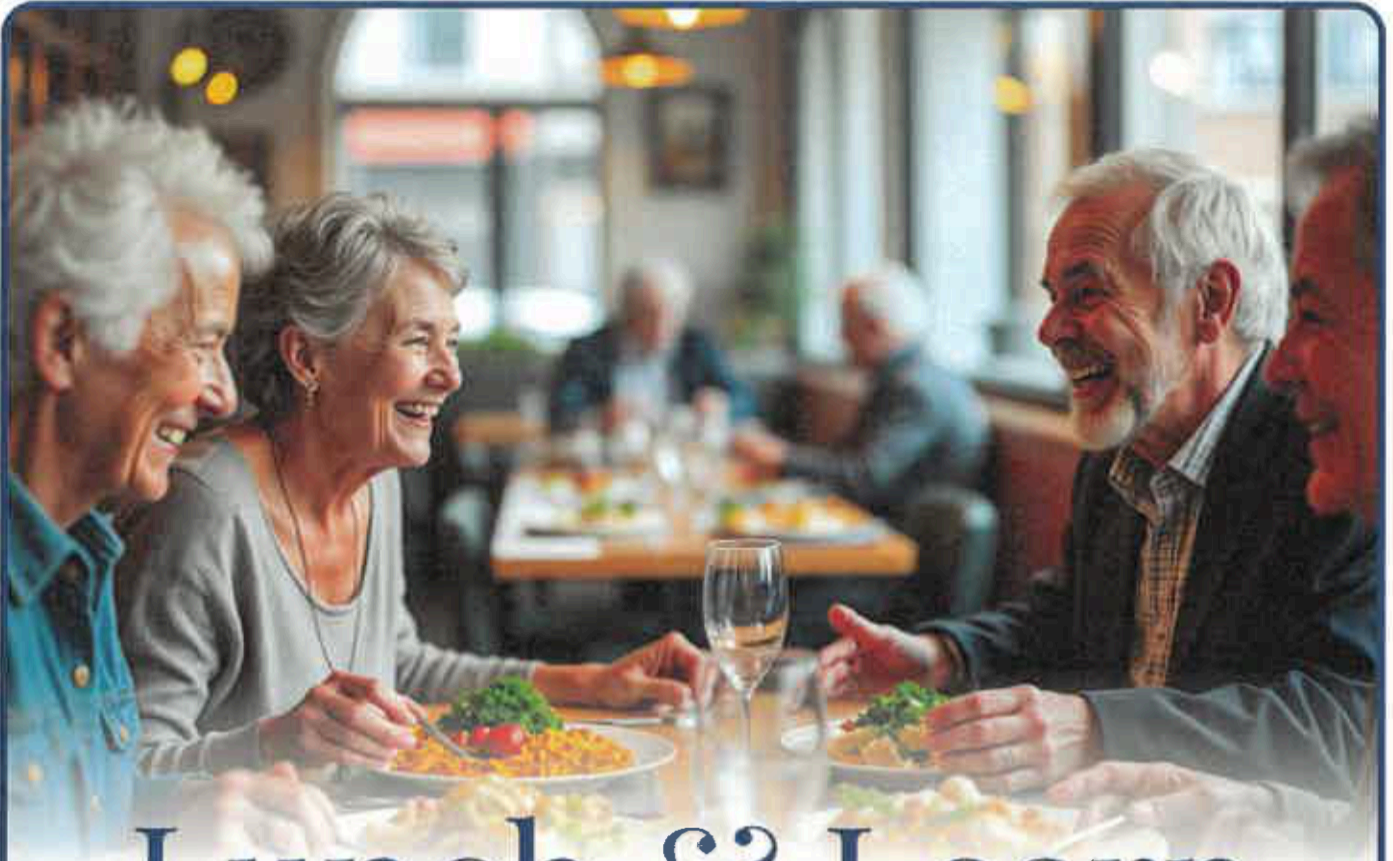

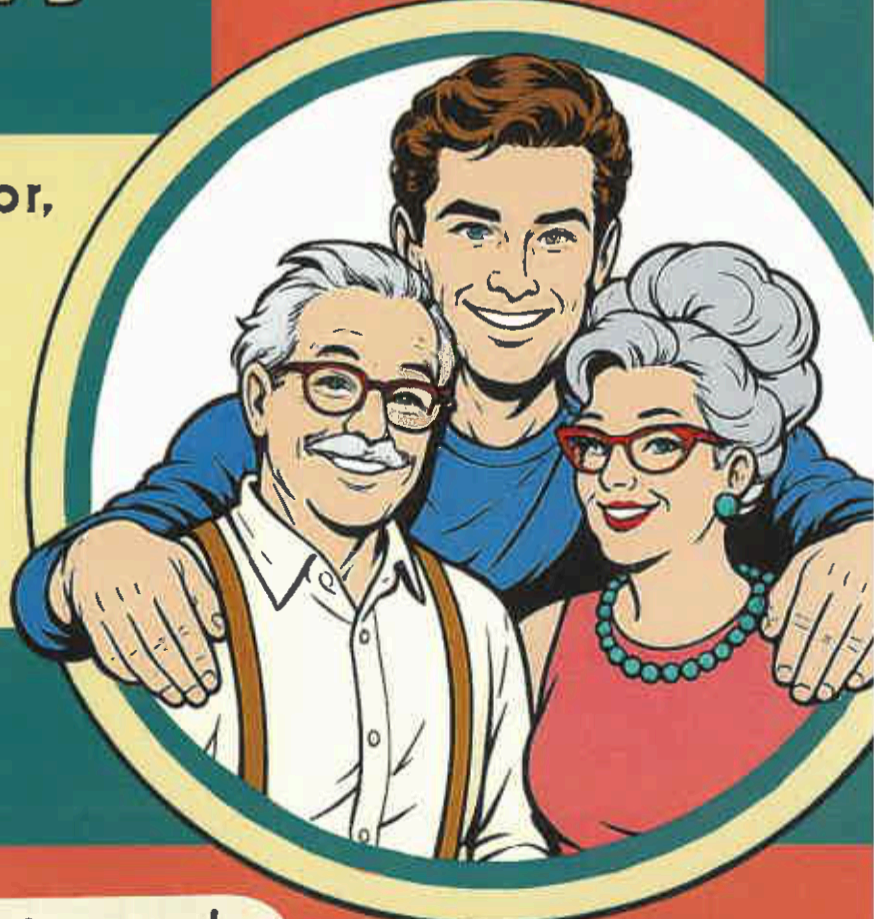
