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President's Message

It has been 6 months since this board has taken office. I thought it might be a time for a look back at what we've accomplished.

My mantra this year was cooperation, collaboration, compromise and civility. And then we added a 5th 'c' – change.

I think the board has lived up to all these. We work together towards common goals, cooperatively and collaboratively. While we don't always agree, we all support the decisions made by the majority. We have compromised and ensure everyone's views are heard. And we do so civilly – there are no loud disagreements and arguments at board meetings. We work together to find common ground and work towards common goals.

What we've done:

- We have instituted a parliamentarian who helps keep us on track and following Robert's Rules of Order.
- We have been following Robert's Rules of Order, and our attorney's advice, in our minutes and board meetings. I know that some people feel the minutes are lacking information, but they are the standard by Robert's Rules.
- We have implemented board workshops. These allow us to discuss 'hot topics' that will come before the board with the residents. Residents who attend can voice their opinion to the board and we are listening. While we may not always do exactly what you, personally, want, we are following our residents' voices, and what is best for GTV.
- We ARE listening. Besides the board workshops, every rep is holding district meetings. Again, these allow the residents to voice their concerns and issues to their reps. Most are well attended.
- We have implemented standard business email accounts so you can reach us. These email accounts will be turned over to the new district reps and they will have the history of issues and feedback, so they are not 'blind' when they take their position.
- We have approved an updated Employee Handbook and established a Lifestyle Spending account to give our staff some limited benefits.
- We have established a new HOA packet and corresponding fee in order to recoup the costs of our employees for preparing this.
- We have approved the contract for the sewer lining project to help protect and repair our sewer pipes.
- The Property Committee and volunteers are working on painting 10 MPH on the streets to help make residents aware of the speed limit.
- We authorized purchase and installation of a new stove in the kitchen, making it safer and cleaner.
- Maintenance is working with a vendor to reseal the pool decks.
- We are working hard to review the options, benefits, and costs of outsourcing our management to a property management company, as well as looking at wages and benefits to ensure our staff are paid appropriately and have some benefits.

Of course, there have been bumps along the way. There always are. However, the board has joined together to ensure we are working towards the best for Greentrees. Some may not agree with this assessment, and that is just fine. We are proud of our work so far this year and are looking forward to what we can accomplish in the next 6 months.

And now, let's get to work.

Manager's Message

As some of you may know, we have been down a maintenance worker for a few weeks. We are pleased that Josh is back on light duty for a few weeks. Frankly, we expected him to be out much longer. Being young and the miracles of modern medicine! Aaron, Caesar and Dave have stepped up in Josh's absence, taking on his work. We had been exploring other options to fill in when we found out he could return. I want to thank all 3 of the guys for stepping up.

Dandelions! They are really aggressive this year. Maintenance mows them every week, yet I think they grow as fast as they get mowed down. We can't spray with weed killer as it impacts the bees and could impact pets. There are rocks in the RV park grass, which makes weed whacking them hard since the rocks can get picked up and damage an RV. We are working with Property Committee to investigate other options.

The office is working on getting ready for our annual meeting on August. In anticipation of a 4-cent price increase in July, we purchased enough stamps to send the 3 mailings (annual meeting, election, and statements at year end). This saved us about \$75.

Beth has been busy the past couple of weeks working with several new owners, getting them registered and meeting with them to go over the rules, and processes. You may have new neighbors. Say hello and welcome them to GTV.

Our Own Villagers: *Meet Shirley Kaasa*



I am pleased to share some reflections on Shirley Kaasa, who was one of the first residents I met when we moved to GTV in 2019. While she describes herself as introverted, I see her as a strong, stable, and reliable pillar of our community.

Shirley was born in North Dakota in the 1930s. Her family moved to Eugene when she was a small child. Following WWII, she married her childhood friend, Bruce. They raised 3 children - twins plus another son and ran a cattle farm in rural Springfield for 40 years. Sadly, one of her twins recently passed away due to heart complications.

Shirley's family has deep roots here. Her parents and uncles owned lots in

the early days of GTV. She fondly remembers the frequent potlucks and social events where everyone worked together in the kitchen and enjoyed each other's company. After inheriting her parents' property, she and Bruce settled in permanently. While Bruce spent his time fishing on local lakes and rivers, Shirley built lasting friendships within the community.

After Bruce passed away unexpectedly in 2000, Shirley decided to upgrade from her parents' single-wide trailer. She picked out a manufactured home, had it delivered to Greentrees, where she still lives comfortably today.

At one time, Shirley served temporarily as an alternate on the Greentrees Board. She has been pleased with the current Board and that Roberts Rules are being observed in our meetings.

It has been a true pleasure spending time with Shirley and remembering the "good 'ol days."

GERT Corner

Greentrees Emergency Response Team (GERT)

On Sunday June 14th, some of GERT's team members assisted in multi-agencies annual emergency drill. GERT's Kristel Buechner, Frank Vigna and Ken Petersen participated in this years annual Oregon Disaster Airlift Response Team (ODART) with the real world exercise. Frank was at his home base radio transmitting wind speed, temperature along to Kristel at Flornece Airport on Portable Hand Transmitter Radio with Ken Petersen with his portable base unit Radios. Kristel relaying the information on to the contact at Siltcoos Lake and debriefing pilots with overseeing the situation at the airport.

Florence had 3 planes landing with vital supplies in the event of a disaster. In this scenario 600 lbs of food was delivered to Flornece Food Share with an emergency supply of medication to GTV GERT via One Float Plane 2 landing at Flornece Airport. The life saving medication for GTV was a box of PPE and some over the counter medication. But in the event of an actual emergency this would be an important resource for GERT.

In order for GERT's Search and Rescue team to know who may need lifesaving medication GERT is asking for residents to fill out their registration form for each district. GERT will be attending District meetings to discuss how this all comes together.

The Radio team every month tests how many homes, residents and those with mobility difficulties, oxygen, dialysis and insulin needs and related damages if a disaster happened. For future reference GERT needs real numbers and space numbers to administer care in the event of an emergency ie: Earthquake, tsunami disaster situations.

For the team to help you in a disaster.

Disaster planning, drills and practice are highly recommended as the saying goes practice makes perfect.

Restaurant Review

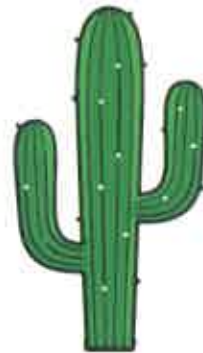


Garibaldi Mexican Restaurant

GREENBELTS

It has come to our attention recently that the understanding of, the use of and ownership of the Greenbelt between properties is not realized by the owners and renters in Greentrees. The primary purpose of the Greenbelt is privacy between residences. This was put into effect when Greentrees was started and has been a selling point for many years. The Greenbelt is designed so trimming both sides of the belt is the responsibility of the homeowner/renter. This does not mean you can cut your side down. The Greenbelt belongs to the residents; however, it is not usable space. You cannot have a structure on your portion of the green belt but must maintain the area as a barrier for privacy and percolation drainage. I hope this information will help in restoring the greenbelts that have been removed. If you have questions, please contact your District Representative for help.

FEATURED RULE OF THE MONTH

4.9. Greenbelts

- a. Greenbelts, per CC&Rs 10.4.1, are a primary design feature which make GTV unique. Greenbelts provide a natural privacy screen between neighboring lots and required storm drainage. Preservation of our greenbelts not only provides a visually pleasing esthetic to our lots, but they also maintain the naturalistic look of GTV, support wildlife, and serve as natural wind breaks.
- b. The GTV ACC enforces greenbelts within required setbacks for any new development and regulates the redevelopment of existing greenbelts. Issues with established or legacy greenbelts between adjacent properties that fall outside guidelines listed below must be negotiated between the associated property owners.
- c. Guidelines are provided below to characterize a common greenbelt between the majority of lots. Legacy greenbelts may be non-traditional due to natural variations in land patterns and lot sizing, or they may be non-existent. Consult the ACC if you have questions or concerns regarding your greenbelt.
 - i. Greenbelts serve as a required, undeveloped, setback from the property line, as specified in Table 1: GTV Lot Coverage and Setbacks.
 - ii. Greenbelts shall not be used for lot development, storage, fences, parking, or lot access.
 - iii. Greenbelts should be maintained at all property lines that border other HOA member properties. Rectangular lots should have greenbelts at the sides and rear, triangular lots, or corner lots, should have greenbelts at two sides.
 - iv. Greenbelts should be maintained for privacy and consist of native or naturalized, non-invasive plants. Evergreen varieties are preferred to provide a year-round privacy screen.
 - v. Planting of trees that will grow more than thirty (30) feet high in closely-spaced greenbelts is strongly discouraged.
 - vi. Greenbelts should be cooperatively and collaboratively maintained by owners and neighbors so that they do not pose a hazard to neighboring properties. Removal of dead trees and brush is highly recommended and encouraged.

In addition, our attorney will be presenting information on the draft CC&Rs. He will speak of the importance of the vote for this, and the significant changes. A draft copy of the CC&Rs will be available for pickup at the meeting, along with the attorney's summary letter. If you cannot make the annual meeting, the draft CC&Rs will be available after the meeting on the Greentrees website in the Owner's area. If you would rather a printed copy, you can contact the office for the printed copy and we will send it to you.

After the meeting, a lunch will be served to all attendees in the Rec Hall and, weather permitting, in the family pool area.

This is a great opportunity to socialize with your neighbors, meet some new neighbors and interact with your board representative. Please ensure your mailing address is correct to ensure you receive your packet. We expect the mailing to go out the week of July 12.

These teen age looking people have been seen around the community prior to and after this incident.

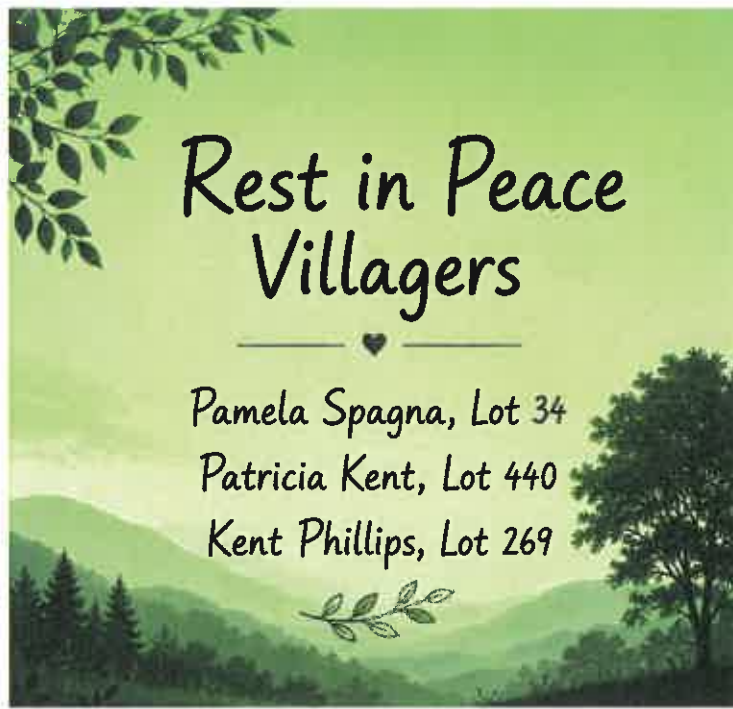
June 9th coming out of Circle Road, west side, headed to the gate. Then several minutes later on 9th street down in front of the police dept. headed east towards the highway.

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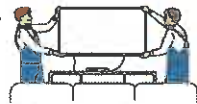

- Up to \$1,000 toward an emergency building repair bill
